1) How old is your current library? Was it constructed specifically as a library? Or was it retrofitted? What sources of money were used? Federal, state, tribal, other?	12 years old. It is a triple wide modular building that was to be for a temporary use but due to lack of funding we have not gone forward. Tribal funds were used to purchase the building.	
2) Is your request contained in HB137 for new construction, renovation or expansion?	New construction for a permanent building.	
3) What do you feel is an accurate amount? How did you determine that amount? Do you need technical assistance to determine the amount?	Our original amount of 4.2 million was just for construction cost not for internal costs (ie computers, desks, office equipment.). We determined it by utilizing Buffalo Design Architect Group for the cost. The amount now has moved up to 4.5 million.	
4) Do you have a current library? If so, how many people use it per year? How many of those are K-12 students?	Yes: patrons 1926 - 982 K-12 students

8) What are other sources of internet access in your community? Home, community center?	Community Center has wireless but limited access, McDonalds WiFi, students have to sit in the eating area and do homework. Very few homes have internet due to cost of the service.	
9) What is the nearest internet access for community members who don't have access at home?	Acoma Learning Center	
10) What percentage of community members would you guess have access to the internet at home? Majority, a small minority? Is cost an issue, or availability of service?	5%-10% have internet access in their homes:  15% of home access. Cost is an issue for all families and some areas don't have access to the cabling. Some use cellular Mobile wifi hotspots but that is also limited due to cell phone plan.	
11) Is there a public school on the reservation? How far is it from your community? Does it have a library?	No; The closest High School 12 miles away in Laguna Pueblo and the Grants High School is about 21 miles away and they both have libraries.	
12) Is there a BIE school in your community? Where is it geographically located? Does it have a library?	No, the Pueblo of Acoma recently took over the BIE School and now is tribally operated. The Haaku Community Academy is located across from the tribal community center and yes it has a library.	
13) What is the population of your community?	5,000+ - Enrolled Tribal Members 2,150-Community Members of the surrounding Communities. San Fidel, Cubero Land Grant	
14) Are there any additional details that you want to share about your tribal library's needs?	The Acoma Learning Center needs a new building due to the lack of space, computer lab, class rooms, activity room, childrens area, library lacks sufficient internet access, Conference/Meeting room and study space for students.

Question	Response
1) How old is your current library? Was it constructed specifically as a library? Or was it retrofitted? What sources of money were used? Federal, state, tribal, other?	It is unknown when the Cochiti Library was constructed, but based on construction drawings, we can assume that the <b>library was completed in 1995-96</b> . The library was <b>retrofitted in the early 2000s and in 2016</b> that included constructing a pitched roof over the original flat roof and interior renovations respectively. <b>The interior renovation project utilized NM Capital Outlay and Sandoval County GO Bonds.</b>
2) Is your request contained in HB137 for new construction, renovation or expansion?	<b>No, please revise from \$975,000 to \$1.3M for renovation and expansion.</b>
3) What do you feel is an accurate amount? How did you determine that amount? Do you need technical assistance to determine the amount?	<b>\$1,287,751 is the estimated cost of the Library addition project.</b> The estimate for the project was <b>completed by local Architect, Elizabeth Suina</b> , using numbers from a similar project located in Cochiti Pueblo.
4) Do you have a current library? If so, how many people use it per year? How many of those are K-12 students?	The estimated number of people that utilize the facility is about <b>150 – 175/annual</b> . The number of <b>K-12 students is about 110</b> .
4a) Do you offer any programs targeted at K-12 students (e.g. after school or summer programs, language instruction, tutoring, student support services)? What are your most popular programs?	Yes, we offer <b>Keres Language program during the summer for approximately 100 students</b> . We also offered an <b>academic-based summer program with an anticipated enrollment of 10</b> . <b>After school program</b> included homework help and tutoring. The most popular during the regular school year was the tutoring but during the summer months it was the Keres Language Program.
4b) How many staff do you have and is this adequate?	Specific <b>ONLY</b> to Library Service, we only employ <b>one regular full-time Library Service Coordinator</b> (non-degree/non-licensed). <b>This position is currently vacant</b> . This is not adequate for delivery and sustainability of services. Library Services requires a regular full-time position to be filled by someone with at least a Bachelor Degree with higher pay. <b>Potential candidate must have experience in excellent communication, data analysis, grant writing, library services, cataloging, IT support, special programs and projects.</b>
5) Do you have access to internet in your current library? Do you have an IT person on staff?	<b>We do have internet in the library but we do not have a regular full-time IT person on staff</b> . This is incredibly important as we need consistency in establishing a full tribal wide wifi/Internet infrastructure for the entire community.
6) How many computer stations do you have? How high is the demand for computer stations?	We have <b>18 computer stations</b> . The demand is high simply because of the 18 we only have <b>5 that actually work for browsing</b> . We have at least <b>4 additional that work for word processing</b> .
7) Do you have laptops available for constituents? How many? How does that compare to demand?	<b>We do not have laptops for patrons</b> . I am certain if we have these available for use <b>there would be a demand</b> . Also, when purchasing laptops for community loan the agency/library would be required to develop loan policies especially to ensure that the device is used appropriately in addition to reducing damage or loss, recoup of cost or liability. Also, IT upkeep ensuring that devices are functioning and are updated / cleaned on a regular basis.
8) What are other sources of internet access in your community? Home, community center?	The <b>internet services offered in Pueblo de Cochiti were limited to the library wifi and through a pilot project where limited wifi boxes were provided to tribal members for internet access</b> . During Covid-19, partnership with New Mexico Public Education and other agency (1) to access or obtain support of increasing wireless access points (WAPs) within the community through buses that are to be staged around the community in various areas. The WAPs are still being worked out with various partners.
9) What is the nearest internet access for community members who don't have access at home?	The <b>library eventually, the community will have additional Wireless Access Points available through the community</b> however, I anticipate a shift when schools reopen because the Pueblo is borrowing from buses from LEAs.
10) What percentage of community members would you guess have access to the internet at home? Majority, a small minority? Is cost an issue, or availability of service?	The <b>percentage of community member that have sustainable and continuous access to technology in their homes would average about 5% or less</b> . There are many factors that impact the ability to access internet such as infrastructure and access to bandwidth/leasing, access to devices for safe access within homes and cost for contracts of services.
11) Is there a public school on the reservation? How far is it from your community? Does it have a library?	Yes, Bernalillo Public School District has one public school, <b>Cochiti Elementary and Middle school</b> located on tribal lands. It is approximately 5-9 miles. The school does have a library on-site however, if students are allowed to use this facility after school hours transportation becomes an issue.
12) Is there a BIE school in your community? Where is it geographically located? Does it have a library?	No, there is NOT a BIE school in the community. However, there is a majority of students from Cochiti pueblo that attend Santa Fe Indian School which is a BIE school.
13) What is the population of your community?	<b>Approximately 1200</b>
14) Are there any additional details that you want to share about your tribal library's needs?	Similar to all other tribal libraries the <b>library serves as the "hub" of the community</b> . A place where everyone can come and receive assistance and support when it comes to resources. <b>Students depend on having access to computers, books and reference support for education</b> . In addition, due to the Covid-19 pandemic, many adults have either lost jobs or had a reduction in work hours requiring them to apply for supplemental state assistance including unemployment. Once the economy reopens and the threat of Covid-19 lessens more people will require additional services creating resumes, seeking jobs and establishing emails to obtain sustainable employment. Some may choose to enroll in post-secondary educational institutions which have moved to online classes. This will require access to efficient high speed internet and connectivity. K-12 students learning from home continue to require additional educational support, we are still uncertain as to what learning will look like this coming fall 2020. Many children suffer from loss of educational knowledge, since schools across the country have moved to online learning with reduced hours of instruction and limited teacher-student interaction; many of our students will forget and lose skills. <b>Educational support for k-12 students is anticipate to increase once school starts as many will require additional help with class work.</b>

1) How old is your current library? Was it constructed specifically as a library? Or was it retrofitted? What sources of money were used? Federal, state, tribal, other?	Our library is <b>8 years old</b> . Yes, it was constructed specifically be a library. However, it was built as half of the Library / Education Complex which we share with the Department of Education.  As for money, it was <b>Capital Outlay</b> and <b>Pueblo of Isleta funds</b> .
2) Is your request contained in HB137 for new construction, renovation or expansion?	No
3) What do you feel is an accurate amount? How did you determine that amount? Do you need technical assistance to determine the amount?	I have no idea as to what the cost would be to determine an accurate dollar amount for renovations / modifications.  <b>Technical assistance would be helpful and appreciated.</b>  Yes, we have a current library.  I do not have the numbers of usage on hand as I am currently working from home at the moment.  <b>K-12 students is our primary usage</b> audience as we next to the Isleta Elementary and bus stop locations for various off reservation schools. Plus, we Isleta Head Start and Child Care is down the road and we host weekly story time sessions from them, as well as story times for those students that are not enrolled in the Head Start.  However, we continuously strive to <b>draw in older audiences</b>  <b>Summer Reading Program</b> is our biggest program, followed by the <b>After School Program</b> . Our most consistent program is the <b>Head Start Story time</b> . The Department of Education does the <b>tutoring services</b> BUT they close at 4:30 pm daily and we get the overflow when they close.  We also offered extended hours 8 pm to 12 am during <b>Midterms and College Students</b> . We noticed that High Schoolers like to take advantage of these extended hours for studying purposes as it is restricted for studying purposes only. But we have to make sure they are done and out by 10 pm and that parents or guardians know of their whereabouts.  Every summer we also are a <b>Summer Meal site</b> from May to August.
4) Do you have a current library? If so, how many people use it per year? How many of those are K-12 students?	<b>We have a total of 7. 4 Full-Time and 3 Part-Time.</b> During the normal calendar year this is adequate, <b>but come summer it is not</b> as we also host the Summer Meal Program for the general public.  Yes, we have <b>internet and in-house Wi-Fi</b> . The Wi-Fi is supposed to be accessible outside the complex but our building walls are too thick. We are currently <b>working on getting 4 outside WAPS</b> so Wi-Fi may be available in the Parking Lot, side & back patio, and front court yard.  <b>No we do not have an IT person.</b> We have to rely on the <b>Pueblo's MIS Department</b> which is responsible for the entire Pueblo's Departments. All our technology purposes must be approved by them. The issues are they want technology that works with the Pueblo's network rather than what works for the general public whom does not have Microsoft and other professional applications / software.  We have <b>22 units available</b> which is a mixture of PCs and Macs. <b>14 in the general computer area, 4 in the Children's room, and 4 in the teen room.</b> We had 4 more units in the general area but got rid of them for space reasons and the general public bringing their own devices (laptops and tablets).  Computer demand is still <b>high</b> as people that have their own devices do not have Microsoft software such as Word, Excel, Publisher, and sometimes Excel. Plus, they need to print. The staff has been teaching the patrons on how to use free software such as Google Docs, OpenOffice, iWorks, Camva, etc...  <b>Printing would be the next major task for computer usage.</b> The need for <b>Bluetooth printing or Cloudbased printing</b> would nice as patrons use their email on their mobile devices but do not remember their passwords to open email on library desktops to print. Then we have to go through all the email password recovery which become an issue when someone else set up their phone for them or they have created numerous email account for this same issue but get confused on which username or password to use.  <b>Yes, we have laptops and mac books</b> but they are for Pueblo of Isleta (POI) <b>Department usage</b> as they have the monetary means to replace lost or damaged units. Or we those units for our programs (Summer Reading Program, software classes, etc...)  We are currently <b>submitted the IMLS CARE Act Grant</b> to purchase Hotspots and Chromebook with LTE services to address these needs. No word on grant approval yet.  The <b>Library</b> is the main internet source open to the public which is both <b>fiber and Wi-Fi</b> . During the COVID-19 crisis, the <b>Los Lunas School District</b> provided the Pueblo with Hotspots but only Los Lunas Students have access it.  Other Departments that have public Wi-Fi on the reservation is <b>restricted</b> to POI Department and Isleta Police Department usage. Those other Departments could get Wi-Fi services for their patrons but lack the technological knowledge of how that could enhance their services to the community.  Within the Pueblo, it would be the <b>Library</b> .  Off the Pueblo it would <b>McDonlads</b> on the Southeast end, <b>Starbucks</b> on the Southwest, <b>Los Padillas Youth Center</b> on the Northwest, and the <b>Isleta Resort and Casino</b> on the Northeast of the reservation. All mentioned locations including the library all need serious means of transportation.  The benefit of the library is that we are in the middle of an <b>evolving subdivision</b> .

Those who do have that option to Comcast or CenturyLink use their mobile carriers for Hotspot. Again, this is a luxury item and not as good because most mobile internet is throttled.</p> <p>Many youth bring their gaming consoles to the library to <b>update their software / firmware</b>. Adults are starting to bring their Blu-ray players for similar updating services.</p> <p><b>Beyond the village and subdivision</b>, the Pueblo is comprised of farm and homes are spread out which is why they <b>do not have access to Comcast. CenturyLink</b> provides internet but it is <b>not reliable</b> because people irrigate the internet gets spotty yet community members must still pay for full service while their internet <b>works 50 percent of the time</b>.</p>

Only BIE schools.</b> Nearest off reservation public school would be <b>Bosque Farms Elementary</b> on the Southeast of the reservation and that is about a mile south of the reservation line. <b>Los Lunas High and Middle School</b> are 15 miles on the Southwest end of the reservation, <b>Polk Middle and Rio Grande High School</b> would be 15 and 20 miles northwest of the reservation. No public school are on the Northeast of the reservation.</p> <p>Yes, they should all have libraries within the schools as they are off reservation schools. The <b>Isleta Elementary</b> is tricky because they have a library but not always a librarian. In the past, we worked with the school to provide midday library services to the students so they would have access to a library for research, educational, and technological needs</p>
12) Is there a BIE school in your community? Where is it geographically located? Does it have a library?	<p>Yes, the <b>Isleta Elementary</b>. Located about 100 yards west of our Library.</p> <p><b>Yes, they have a library but not always a librarian.</b> Plus, the school has a high rotation of principles so their need of a library or librarian varies due to the principles own agenda at their moment of reign.</p>
13) What is the population of your community?	<p><b>Approximately 4,837 which is the enrolled tribal member's number.</b> This does not included the "blended non-tribal member" families.</p> <p>Plus, we get a lot of Indigenous people south of the reservation like Silver City or Socorro whom travel to Isleta for our Health Center. For instance, they utilize the Diabetes, Behavioral Health, WIC services and they come to the library for library material needs to help with those services. Therefore, we collaborate with those Departments on library material for their patrons.</p> <p>If they are Indigenous, we want to help them.</p> <p>We also serve local non-tribal members whom are in need of our services. It is the humane thing to do and we get State and Federal money to do so.</p>
14) Are there any additional details that you want to share about your tribal library's needs?	<p>We would like funds to <b>fix our HVAC unit</b> which serves the Teen Room and Art Rooms. The thermostat is located in the art room which has windows, therefore, affects the temperature in the Teen Room making it too hot a majority of the time. <b>Retractable shade for our North Courtyard.</b> We purchase tarps every summer. Renovate of Public water fountains as the water is always hot. Getting a <b>new hot water heater for the Library / Education Complex. Acquiring 4 outdoors WAPS for Wi-Fi purposes. Repair our Security and Fire Alarm system are both not working properly.</b></p>

The current library was built in 1998, 22 years old. It was built as a library. Designed in 3 phases, the main library was the only phase built. The two other phases were a museum/archives and a computer/technology room. Tribal and state money was used to build it.

The library serves the Pueblo of Laguna's six villages (Laguna, Mesita, Paguate, Encinal, Paraje, and Seama). The villages are spread out among a 10-20-mile radius. From the NMSL Annual Report 2018-2019 there were about 9,000 visits to the library, from July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019. There is not any demographic information available for people visiting to utilize all library services. We do have information for ages 0-18 regarding programming visits through the NMSL Annual Report.	
4a) Do you offer any programs targeted at K-12 students (e.g. after school or summer programs, language instruction, tutoring, student support services)? What are your most popular programs?	Yes we do offer programs for that age range. A majority are combined programming for families. Our most popular program is the Summer Reading Program which is hosted in June and July each year.

Century link only has a certain number of ports available in various areas. Once those are filled they cannot provide new services until one becomes available. Other internet service providers are costly or service is slow.
