What is PubMed?

- Biomedical & health resources database
- Free (National Library of Medicine)
- Contains lots of free full-text resources including journal articles and books
- More than 30 million citations
- PubMed is available at:

MedlinePlus vs. PubMed

Both databases are free and are maintained by the National Library of Medicine

MedlinePlus contains ***consumer health information***

PubMed contains ***scholarly biomedical resources and information***



Searching PubMed

- Topic (keyword and/or MeSH)
- Author
- Title
- Citation
- Journal Name
- Book Name
