

- Help coordinate archives month programming





Pueblo Land Grants

- Spanish community grants given to 23 Pueblo villages (1690s-)
- Under U.S. rule (1848-), initial encroachment and sale of Pueblo land
 - Later reversed, with several legal disputes into the 21st century



Searching Our Online Catalog:

Precision Search

Enter your search term(s) in the search fields to your left. A keyword search will yield broad results while a Title search will yield more narrow results. To further restrict your results, you may combine more than one field. For example: enter "lake" in the filed and select "Photographs only." This restricts your search to photographs only with "lake" in the descriptive title. Some fields also contain droadown options. For additional search to solick on the [2] icon.

New Mexico State Archives

Keyword Search

You may conduct a basic keyword search in the Search by keyword field above also. You may use a single word or several. For example: enter "river/fish*" in the keyword prompt advented to the Search button. This presents a browse of titles containing the word "river" or any word starting with "fish." You may also restrict your keyword search by clicking on the checkbox to restrict the search to photographs only. You may also pick a specific material type.

Popular

Click the Popular button above to see a listing of the most popular collections searched. Instructions will appear on the right. Navigate up and down the hierarchy of information. Return to the top ribbon and click the Clear or Refresh Window button to start the second search.

Save Lists / Email Requests

As you select and tag resources from the search results, they are saved to a current list at the top of the screen. The current list allows you to save selected items for future use, view list details in a separate browse window, print, or email the list to our reference desk requesting resources.

New Session

New Session will delete your current saved lists and return you to the search page to begin again.

Aulti-Lingual

You can translate the detail display page to any written language using the Google Translate link on the page. It permits users to log in with the language of their choice and work entirely in that language.

Related Link

Explore additional information by clicking the Related links at the right of the top ribbon.

Social Networking

Take advantage of the various social networking links at the bottom of the detail display page. Use them to share interesting findings with your friends.




